Lighting of the Advent Candles

Today is the second Sunday in Advent. Last week, we lit the first candle in our Advent wreath, the candle that represents hope. (*The first purple candle is lit*)

Today we light the second candle, the candle that represents peace. We live in a world longing for peace: a peace that will squash wars and the devastation wars leave behind, a peace that will reunite families, a peace that will restore minds and spirits.

Knowing the need for peace in our lives and in this conflicted world, we light this candle as a symbol of the peace promised in the coming of Jesus. (The second purple candle is lit)

Scripture Readings:

Luke 1:68-79 from VU p. 900

Blessed be the God of Israel, who has come to the people and set them free, who has raised up for us a mighty Saviour, born of the house of the servant David. Through the holy prophets of old God promised to save us from our enemies, from the hands of all who hate us, to show the mercy promised to our ancestors, to remember the holy covenant, the oath God swore to our ancestors Abraham and Sarah, to set us free from the hands of our enemies, free to serve God without fear, holy and righteous in God's presence, all the days of our life. **God shall fulfill the promise and bring the people peace.** And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare the way, to give the people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins.
